GENERAL CONDITIONS

Conditions in state law and regulations cited above, are hereby made a part of this permit/license. All activities authorized herein must be carried out in accord with and for the purposes described in the application submitted. Continued validity, or renewal, of this permit is subject to complete and timely compliance with all applicable conditions, including the filing of all required information and reports.

The validity of this permit is also conditioned upon strict observance of all applicable federal, local or other state laws.

Permittee may possess and raise no more than six (6) diamondback terrapins.

Best practices for housing, handling, and transport of diamond-backed terrapin hatchlings should be followed. Diamondback terrapins may not be housed in the same classroom with any other reptiles or amphibians. If terrapins are to be placed into an aquarium that has previously held reptiles or amphibians, the aquarium must be cleaned thoroughly with a 10% bleach solution by allowing the solution to sit for at least 10 minutes, scrubbing the aquarium, and rinsing thoroughly with clean water. Hands should be washed both before and after handling terrapins.

This permit does not authorize the use of any chemical therapeutic and/or drug to treat terrapins held or raised under this permit. Chemical therapeutics and/or drugs may be used only under the direct supervision of a qualified veterinarian and in accordance with the Food and Drug administration guidelines.

Permittee shall obtain all necessary local permits and comply with all applicable health and environmental laws and regulations.

Permittee shall maintain records to indicate where diamondback terrapins have been obtained. All records shall be maintained at the facility or at a specified location other than the facility for three (3) years. Records shall be made available for inspection by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) or its designee. Permittee shall also allow DNR to inspect the facility and any of the permittees equipment, records or product relating to the care of the diamondback terrapins at any reasonable time.

Permittee agrees to notify WHS and the master permit holder immediately upon discovery of any disease affecting the diamondback terrapins at the facility that has the potential to contaminate native or naturalized plants or animals.
